As of 22 April, 2022, Thailand's Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) has approved the lifting of the RT-PCR testing requirement, thus allowing international arrivals to enter Thailand without the pre-arrival, nor arrival tests effective from 1 May, 2022. The progress for Thailand to reopen is moving forward continually.

Thailand Reopening - Updated Entry Rules



Starting from 1 May, 2022, Thailand lifts RT-PCR testing requirement for international arrivals. Travellers will be allowed to enter Thailand without the pre-arrival nor arrival tests. Two new entry schemes have been specifically customised for vaccinated and unvaccinated travellers.

New Entry Rules for Vaccinated Travellers:

International travellers who are fully vaccinated will no longer be required to show proof of a pre-arrival negative RT-PCR test, nor undergo an arrival test.

They are still required to register for a Thailand Pass (via https://tp.consular.go.th/) with a certificate of the COVID-19 vaccination and an insurance policy with coverage no less

than US\$10,000 (reduced from US\$20,000). Registration on the Thailand Pass for travellers entering Thailand from 1 May, 2022, under new entry measures will be opened from 29 April, 2022, onwards (00.01 Hrs. Thailand time). Once arriving in Thailand, they will be allowed entry and are free to go anywhere in the Kingdom.

New Entry Rules for Unvaccinated Travellers:

Option 1 - Exemption from quarantine

Travellers with a negative RT-PCR test result issued within 72 hours before traveling must :

- Register on the Thailand Pass (via https://tp.consular.go.th/).
- Attach the required documents including passport, and COVID-19 RT-PCR test result issued within 72 hours before travelling (must attach on the Thailand Pass only).
- Attach proof of insurance with at least \$10,000 USD coverage for medical treatment in Thailand.

Please note that any COVID-19 test after arriving in Thailand is not required.

Option 2 – Quarantine

Travellers who cannot undergo an RT-PCR test result within 72 hours before travelling or wish to be quarantined must :

- Register on the Thailand Pass (via https://tp.consular.go.th/).

- Attach the required documents including passport and Alternative Quarantine (AQ) hotel confirmation for 5 nights (including 1 RT-PCR test).

- Attach proof of insurance with at least \$10,000 USD coverage for medical treatment in Thailand.

- Undergo an RT-PCR test on Day 4 - 5 in Thailand during the mandatory 5-day quarantine at the AQ hotel.

Please note that the official directives will be announced in the Royal Thai Government Gazette soon. In addition, registration on the Thailand Pass for entering Thailand from 1 May, 2022, under the new entry rules will be opened from 29 April, 2022, onwards (00.01 Hrs. Thailand time).

While in Thailand, both vaccinated and unvaccinated travellers are advised to strictly follow the health and safety standards. Travellers who are experiencing COVID-like symptoms should get tested. 
